**PUBLIC PORTION OF MEETING:
MEETING IS CALLED TO ORDER BY THE MAYOR:**

MAYOR McNABOE: The public portion of this meeting to order anybody wishing to speak during the public portion of our meeting please sign in behind our Clerk. I'd like to ask you to stand for a moment of silence and a salute to the flag.

MOMENT OF SILENCE AND SALUTE TO FLAG:

MAYOR McNABOE: Tonight we begin by welcoming Freehold Regional High School District Assistant Superintendent for Business Administration Sean Boyce and Manalapan Township Principal Doctor Adam Angelozzi gentlemen.

MR. ANGELOZZI: Good evening Township Committee members I'd like to thank you for giving me the opportunity to speak this evening and I'd like to thank Mr. Boyce for having my back this evening as well. I'm here to speak to you about a referendum vote that will take place on Tuesday October 2nd. The Freehold Regional High School District will hold the referendum vote for FRHSD 'Ensuring Excellence' a 39.8-million-dollar referendum to upgrade our facilities. This is an opportune time as existing debt from the construction of Colts Neck High School is expiring and after

careful consideration of both long and short term needs the scope of work has been refined to be allowed for a shared benefit of the expiring debt. A two third reinvestment into the district's facilities and a one third tax levy reduction; additionally, the State will cover almost thirty percent of the cost of the project encompassing over 1.1 million dollars. Therefore, FRHSD 'Ensuring Excellence' is balanced among all six high schools and is comprised of four core areas including security, modern learning environment, athletic and facilities and infrastructure. For Manalapan High School this means the following; in the area of security we will be getting a security vestibule or office that provides two locked doors between the student body and any visitors to the school. This way when visitors come to the school, whether they're signing students out or whether they're contractors they can be vetted by security before being either allowed into the building or students being signed out through the security office. Additionally, there'll be upgraded door locks that allow for classroom doors to be dead bolted from the inside while still adhering to fire code. And an upgrade to our existing internal public announcement or PA system. As far as modern learning is concerned, two of our technology education rooms will be renovated to allow for instructional areas where students can collaborate and communicate on more complex long range projects. While other well ventilated smaller areas will enable students to fabricate, manufacture and create. Over all the new space is being designed to change with the times in order to provide the students with innovated and updated technologies in a readily adaptable space. There are two major athletic facilities upgrades the first of which is a turf field in our stadium that will be lined for multiple field sports. And the second is five tennis courts so that both our boys' and girls' tennis teams can practice and play at home. There would also be safety upgrades to our bleachers. Finally, we would be receiving much needed repairs and resurfacing for both our large flat roof and the paved areas on the exterior of the building. We have created a website dedicated to the FRHSD 'Ensuring Excellence' referendum please visit the website and see in further details what improvements are planned for Manalapan High School and the other five schools within the district. Our end goal is to ensure world class schools for our students and faculty today and into the future please help us get the word out to the community about the importance of voting on October 2nd. If you have any questions, please feel free to ask.

MRS. COHEN: Thank you can I ask a question?

MAYOR McNABOE: Sure you may.

MRS. COHEN: Thank you for coming and explaining this to us. I see that you have a lot of emphasis on learning and safety issues can you just touch on the door handles a little bit and give me some more information on that, on the classrooms and ---

MR. ANGELOZZI: Sure so as you can imagine there's a lot of classrooms at Manalapan High School so getting all of those locks changed is costly. Right now teachers are expected during class time to have their doors locked. But those doors have to be locked from the outside with a key. If there ever was an emergency and there was a tense situation as a teacher in one of those classrooms, I would still be going out to check to make sure the door is locked. What you don't want to do is really leave that classroom though so these have dead bolts on them so they automatically lock from the inside and then when I say they'd adhere to the fire code you simply hit the handle and the door would open normally at that time. So the teacher would never have to leave the room to lock the classroom door.

MRS. COHEN: Okay thank you very much.

MAYOR McNABOE: Anybody else thank you Doctor I really appreciated you guys coming out and thank you for all you do on behalf of the youth of Manalapan.

The seats will be in the mezzanine section cost is \$92.00 dollars and it includes lunch at Carmines. Call the Senior Center at 732-446-8401 for more information on that. Upcoming programs at the Senior Center Friday October 5th the Manalapan Walgreens will administer flu and pneumonia shots at the Senior Center from 11:00 AM to 1:00 PM. On Thursday October 11th the Senior Center will host the AARP Safe Driving Program from 9:30 to 3:30 cost is \$15.00 dollars for AARP members and \$20.00 dollars for nonmembers. Friday October 19th at 12 noon the Monmouth County Clerk Christine Hanlon will visit the Senior Center, present information on the services that the County Clerk's office offers to Monmouth County residents. To include veterans and county identification cards, passport applications and renewals, election voter information and she'll talk about the property fraud alert program. The Halloween party is scheduled for Friday October 26th at 10:00 AM wear a costume and join in the fun, a Chicken Holiday lunch will be served and the cost is \$8.00 dollars. Don't forget ongoing classes and activities at the Senior Center including chair yoga, tai chi, strength training, gentle cardio, healthy bones, line dancing, art classes, computer classes, movies, bingo and parties. Recreation last Friday night the movie 'Coco' was shown at the Rec Center on the outdoor screen the attendance was great with over a 120 people there, the weather was perfect and the children seemed to really enjoy the show. Manalapan Rec is accepting registration for youth basketball, Awakenings youth drama, Steel Pan, youth recreation and competitive twirling as well as Saturday Night Out Special Needs Program. The 30th annual Manalapan Monster Mania is scheduled for Monday October 29th in the Rec Center additional information will be forthcoming. And just a note I just wanted to thank again the Principal of Manalapan High School for his presentation and just remind people that the Election Day again for the referendum is Tuesday October 2nd from 4:00 to 8:00 PM that's all I have thanks.

MAYOR McNABOE: Thank you. Committeeman Uniglicht.

MR. UNIGLICHT: Thank you Mayor. Just want to piggyback on Mayor Musich said about the San Genaro Festival, what I loved about it was that it was such a great turnout with the community. You know it's always nice to see a community turnout to an event especially for a volunteer organization like the Gordons Corner Fire Company. Economic Development Council will be hosting a broker open on October 16th 8:00 AM right here in town hall. This is a call to all real estate brokers that do business in Manalapan. We are working on putting together a data base of vacant properties to help work on bringing in new businesses to Manalapan. Shade Tree I'll just mention again as I do every Township Committee meeting that there are a lot of dead Ash Trees out there. If you have one on your property and you're not sure what you need to do with it please contact our Shade Tree Commission, speak with our Forester. But those trees do need to come down they're going to be very very dangerous as we go into the winter months and certainly into next year. Board of Education met last night I have a couple of messages from the Board President. The week of October 1st through the 5th is week of respect. The week of October 15th through 19th is school violence awareness week and the Board wanted me to mention that voted to retain the Weiner Law Group last night to represent the district in a school funding litigation to fight the loss of State aid which is going to have a negative effect on the district. I also just wanted to piggyback off of something that the school board has been messaging out there to parents which is you know the use of these cell phones; I know Doctor Marciante is going around talking about how they're asking parents to pledge that kids under a certain age will stay off these. I just want to reiterate that myself as a parent and a member of this Township Committee and a resident of this town that these can be you know pretty dangerous. So, think about it you know before you put one of these in the kid's hands and just know what they're using it for thank you very much mayor back to you.

MAYOR McNABOE: Thank you Deputy Mayor.

MRS. COHEN: Thank you Mayor this Saturday September 29th at 2:00 PM at the Monmouth County Library on Symmes Road please join the Manalapan Arts Council for an afternoon of Hispanic music and dance to celebrate Hispanic Heritage Month. Coco Mama Band is a United Nation of women from five countries and four continents playing their own kind of Latin music. And --- Latino is a 12-member Latin dance group. It started in 2010 by the TCNJ Hispanic students. They will showcase various dances such as salsa, the bachata and the meringue. You'll be on your feet dancing and swinging to the music unfortunately I'm not going to be able to be there but I'm sure it's going to be a great afternoon. The Manalapan Arts Council will present the Amazing Kreskin the world's greatest mentalist at a free event in Covered Bridge One Amberly Drive in Manalapan. This free event is opened to all Manalapan residents on October 13th at 7:00 PM. Thank you to the Covered Bridge Board of Trustees for providing the venue for this event. We have some messages from our Health Officer Dave Richardson; The Manalapan Township Board of Health wants to keep the community on alert to protect themselves and their families from mosquito bites. The west Nile virus the most significant mosquito born disease risk to humans in our area has been found in mosquitoes throughout New Jersey in numbers significantly higher than in any previous years. The human illness and death has been reported but fortunately to date no mosquito pools or human west Nile has been identified here in Manalapan I just want to keep you on alert. The mosquito season will last on to the first frost temperatures so please keep the appropriate steps to avoid mosquitoes until then. The Manalapan Township Board of Health has announced their flu immunization clinic schedule there are three as follows; Wednesday October 17th at Covered Bridge I from 10:00 o'clock to 11:00 AM it is opened to all Manalapan Residents. Tuesday October 23rd at Manalapan Town Hall from 7:00 to 8:00 PM and that one will accommodate children and on Thursday October 25th here at Manalapan Town Hall from 1:30 to 2:30 PM. The fee is \$20.00 dollars or free to seniors presenting their Medicare Plan B card. Again the Tuesday night October 23rd clinic will accommodate children. The Board of Health is also set their annual rabies immunization clinic for dogs and cats for Saturday November 3rd from 9:00 AM to 11:30 AM at the annex building in the Manalapan Recreation Center near the west entrance and the turf football field. The rabies vaccinations are free, dogs must be on leashes and cats in carriers. And if you receive a notice from the Township please bring it with you it'll help you speed through the process. The Manalapan-Englishtown Community Alliance is also sponsoring a community Narcon training for any resident who wants to know about the --- the Narcon is the trade name --- and it's used to reverse an opioid overdose. The first 30 people in attendance will receive a free Narcon kit to use if necessary. The training will be held on Tuesday November 27th starting at 6:00 PM here in Manalapan Town Hall and it's open to all so please come down. The Manalapan-Englishtown Community Alliance is offering presentations about the threat of substance abuse in our community to any organization or a group that is interested. Whether it's about opioids, marijuana, vaping concerns, alcohol or any illicit use of substance; the Alliance has a message that can be tailored to your group specifically in order to raise awareness. So, please contact Dave Richardson in the Health Department if you'd like to discuss this further or anything that I reported 732-446-8245. The Monmouth County Freeholders, The Manalapan Arts Council and the Board of Trustees of Covered Bridge is once again presenting Mini Made in Monmouth on Sunday December 2nd from 10:30 to 3:30. There'll be 80 plus vendors of products that are made here in Monmouth County. They'll be on sale on time for Chanukah and Christmas gifts and if you're interested in being a vendor you can call 732-431-7470 for more information we'd love to have Manalapan vendors there. And if you have not signed up for our e-mail blast please do so mtnj.org or like us on our Manalapan Township Facebook page that's the best way to find out information about what's happening in our town thank you Mayor.

MAYOR McNABOE: Thank you. The Manalapan Crossings application for Route 527 and Route 33 was heard by the --- or the first partial hearing of it partial meeting it was Thursday 9/13. For those of you listening the next meeting of the Planning Board which is tomorrow night 9/27 in this building right here will not be hearing the Crossings application. So for those that will be attending the next application or the next meetings of the Manalapan Township Planning Board are October 11th and October 25th both of those meetings will have the Crossings application on as it stands now. Be sure to follow on our website that the Deputy Mayor mentioned mtnj.org move over you can hit agendas click and go down to Planning Board for that date it'll tell you exactly what's on. But by the same token it tells you this meeting if you want the Township Committee or a Zoning Board. So all of those agendas are there make sure you read them so that if there's something is important to you you want to be part of the process by all means come out to them all meeting are opened to the public. Our last coffee with the Mayor here was quite successful it was Saturday September 15th. Many of the residents came out, many of the students from our law enforcement and public service programs some are in

attendance tonight. So thank you for coming out. Our next coffee with the Mayor will be Sunday October 7th 8:30 to 10:00 o'clock here again in Town Hall. So, anybody having issues they want to come out evenings aren't convenient for them or they don't want to be in a public forum and stand in a televised meeting or that type of thing please come to our informal coffees with the Mayor and get your point across. So, if there's something in town that you think your elected officials should be concerned with by all means come out and have a one on one or one on a couple and discuss that. Movie in the park was on September 21st so to all the young people of Manalapan that came out and saw 'Coco' great turnout on a cool evening so not too hot in the park and that was nice. So that kind of wraps up our park concerts and movies but again as was mentioned earlier there will be the MAC events that are being done in the Library and the likes of that. So please come on out a lot of good things going on. We will have on October 6th our Races which is our Ham Radio Operators who are imperative to our emergency management plan will be here testing at this building between 10:00 and 2:00 on October 6th. So if you have an interest in amateur radios come out and talk to I guess the professionals of the amateur radio business and certainly I thank them in advance for everything they do. You're going to hear later tonight on October 17th at 7:00 o'clock here we're going to do a town hall for anybody in Manalapan that is in the low lying areas near our brooks or areas that flood or the likes of that. So again you be here we have met with our DEP these brooks have been walked there is something things that can be done with our residents that are right on there. So, again I want to mention it early enough so that everybody could put it on the calendar I've invited many people out for these and we haven't had a great turnout. So, if you're affected in the low lying areas of the flood those of you that were affected on May 27th and last night quite a scare I guess we'd say. So, we were mobilized we were ready to go we had the heavy rain coming down and yet it stopped just in time. So Lt. Dobbin who is in attendance to you all your men that mobilized last night they were ready should it flood if you get back to the rank and file the appreciation that the Township Committee has for what they did last night we'd appreciate it. At 7:00 o'clock tomorrow night the 'Hidden in Plain Sight' I don't think anybody mentioned that right our Community Alliance this'll be at MEMS again I hope this is televised in time but again the Community Alliance and the rapid drug use, the opioid use so again if this is something anybody with children in school it should be something you want to do don't be the parent that said it wouldn't happen to me make sure you come out know the signs, hear the stories. So that's tomorrow night in MEMS. The golf outing for our MBA the Manalapan Business Association was postponed so that is October 8th that'll be during the day if you log on to the website Manalapan Business Association you'll have the whole thing. I know it's a nine and dine I don't know what time the golfing starts but if you don't golf and you just want to come out and support the businesses in town you can just do the dine afterwards. So log on to their website get all that information. And the last thing although there'll be another meeting I want to mention it in advance October 13th will be our shredding event in the Franklin Lane lot between 9:00 and 1:00 o'clock. So for all of you that have confidential information that have a garage that are cluttered with stuff that you want to clean out and get shredded by all means start getting it ready for the 13th 9:00 to 1:00 o'clock in the Franklin Lane parking lot more will follow at our next meeting as there is one more meeting before that. Safe Streets to Transit is for to install miscellaneous sidewalks throughout the town including Route 9. And the Municipal Aid is the more common one where we receive grant money and that's for the installation of or actually this is for resurfacing of Gordons Corner Road between Conmack and Pease Road. Authorizing these resolutions will allow us to submit the grant application and if we did receive funding it would authorize administration to execute the grant agreement so and they are on the consent agenda.

And so we often times do these resolutions supporting these different laws and this was an important one to us to let our taxpayers know we're still looking out for them. We're hoping that this additional money will come in that these bills will be looked at they'll be discussed and an ultimately approved so that additional funding will come into both regional districts. So, we put together some language for this resolution and we'll send it off to all our State, county local officials both our school boards so that they are aware that you know we're hoping and looking out for our taxpayers as well.
