Registration begins February 17 at 9:00 am

<u>Summer Recreation Program Registration Information</u>

The Summer Camp Program is for resident children who are currently in grades K-7. Children who are currently in grade 8 may apply as a CIT.

Registration maximum is 1000 campers.

Registration Fees and Dates

The registration fee if registered by March 11th is \$590.00

The registration fee if registered after March 11th until April 15th is \$650.00

The registration fee if registered after April 15th is \$725.00

There will be no switching permitted once a group has filled.

Transportation Fee and Date

The transportation fee is \$175

*Transportation cannot be guaranteed after May 6th

After Care Fee

The After Care fee is **\$215** for the entire seven week program (32 days). The daily fee for After Care is **\$8.**

FUNDAMENTALS OF THE MANALAPAN SUMMER RECREATION PROGRAM

Location and Length

All of the camp groups are centrally located at the Manalapan Recreation Center directly across from the Municipal Building on Route 522. The Recreation Center is conducive to a variety of activities for the campers while maintaining effective supervision. Local schools are used in the event of inclement weather. The program runs from Wednesday, June 29 through Friday, August 12 (no program July 4).

<u>Organization</u>

For effective management and organization, the camp groups are divided into four Clusters. Cluster 1 includes all campers who are currently in kindergarten and first grades. Cluster 2 includes all campers who are currently in second and third grades. Cluster 3 includes all campers who are currently in fourth and fifth grades. Cluster 4 includes all campers who are currently in sixth and seventh grades. Each grade is also subdivided into several smaller groups each headed by a Group Supervisor. The Group Supervisor positions are filled by either adults with teaching experience or upper classmen in college with significant experience as a summer camp employee. To assist with visibility and management, each group will be assigned a specific colored T-shirt.

Trips

Our vision includes a focus on bringing a high quality experience to the campers at the Manalapan Recreation Center. For variety, the program offers some off site day trips for those who wish to participate. Campers in Cluster 1 and 2 and 3 will have the opportunity to register for approximately seven "major" trips. Cluster 4 campers will have the opportunity to register for at least ten trips throughout the camp season. All trips require an additional registration fee per trip. Trips are optional and program will always be available at the camp sites should you choose not to send your child on a scheduled trip.

Swimming

With parental consent, campers in all grades will be bussed to local pools for the opportunity to swim approximately twice each week (first and seventh weeks excluded). The swim trips do not require any additional registration fee.

8th Grade and the Counselor In Training (CIT) Program

There is no regular eighth grade camper program. Current eighth graders who wish to be a part of the program can apply to be a member of the CIT program. We will be accepting a maximum of 30 CITs this year. Applications are available at www.mtnj.org.

Application cut-off is Friday, March 25.

After Care Service Available

To offer parents an option of picking up their children later than the normal departure time (2:45-3:00 pm), an administrator and a group of After Care counselors are available from 3:00-4:30 pm every camp day. For an additional registration fee, parents can choose to register their children for the entire seven week Summer Recreation After Care program. Alternatively, parents can make selective use of the After Care program at a daily rate. Please note that the daily rate applies any time a camper is picked up after 3:00 pm. After Care is held at the Kuschick Pavilion.
