Three Sources for Water in Manalapan

- Well Water 5% of homes
- ► Gordons Corner Water Company 76% of homes
- Manalapan Township Water / Managed by Veolia Water Company 18% of homes

Well Service in Manalapan

- +/- 750 Homes get their water from a well on their own property.
 - > The homeowner pays for ALL matters related to the well:
 - Electricity
 - Regular Maintenance on system
 - ► Testing & Treating the water
 - > All improvements to the system have a direct benefit to the homeowner.
- The homeowner also pays for improvements to the Manalapan Water System via taxes and the Municipal Budget. These residents get ZERO benefit from the improvements.

Gordons Corner Service in Manalapan

+/- 11,000 Homes get their water from the Gordons Corner Water Company.

- Gordons Corner Water Company has approx. 15,000 customers in Manalapan, Marlboro and Colts Neck.
- > These homes are in the northern section of Manalapan.
- ▶ The homeowner pay Gordons Corner Water for the water they use.
- Included in the bill are improvements for the entire Gordons Corner Water Company network regardless of where you reside. These improvements could benefit the homeowner.
- Rates are overseen by the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities.
- The homeowner also pays for improvements to the Manalapan Water System, managed by Veolia for 30+ years via taxes and the Municipal Budget. These residents get ZERO benefit from the improvements.

Manalapan Township System Managed by Veolia

- +/- 2,800 Homes get their water from system managed by the Veolia Water Company.
 - Veolia Water has 100,000,000 customers worldwide.
 - These homes are in the southern section of Manalapan.
 - The homeowner pay Veolia for the water they use and minor maintenance repairs to the system and could benefit the homeowner.
 - Rates are overseen by the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities.
- The homeowner also pays for improvements to the Manalapan Water System, managed by Veolia for 30+ years via taxes and the Municipal Budget. These residents do benefit from the improvements.
