


ABOUT BIRD FLU

Bird flu, or Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI) H5N1, is a virus that mainly spreads among birds. Bird flu is a zoonotic disease, meaning it can spread from animals to humans. Infected pets can become severely ill, and the virus poses a risk to public and animal health.



HOW TO PROTECT YOUR PETS



Do NOT feed raw (unpasteurized) milk or dairy products to pets.



Do NOT feed raw or undercooked meat to pets.



Keep pets away from wild birds and poultry, including where they gather to avoid bird poop.



Always provide fully cooked pet food, following the **USDA** guidelines for handling and thorough cooking, or trusted commercial pet food products.

SIGNS OF BIRD FLU IN PETS

- Loss of Appetite
- Fever
- Letharay
- Difficulty Breathing
 Trouble Walking
- Runny Nose or Eyes
- Tremors or Shaking
- Seizures
