Shade Trees

Tulip tree, 1.5"-2" caliper - \$385 each

Black gum, 1.5"-2" caliper - \$385 each

Bur oak, 1.5"-2" caliper - \$385 each

Silver linden, 1.5"-2" caliper - \$375 each

Medium sized trees

Fringetree, 6' tall, multi-stem - \$385 each

Carolina silverbell, 1.5"-2" caliper - \$410 each

Sweetbay magnolia, 1.5"-2" caliper - \$385 each

Hophornbeam, 1.5"-2" caliper - \$410 each

Evergreen

American holly, 5-6' tall - \$475 each

We hope this opportunity makes it easier to fulfill tree removal permit replacement requirements! And of course, now is always a great opportunity to plant trees!

Tulip tree, *Liriodendron tulipifera*



1.5"-2" caliper, \$385 each

Native species

Large, stately maturing tree - 60' +

Early summer flowers are greenish yellow with an orange band and look like tulip flowers

Plant in full sun, will tolerate partial shade. Fast grower

Major nectar source for pollinators, larval host for butterflies, and food source for wildlife.

Black gum, *Nyssa sylvatica* (also called black tupelo or sour gum)



1.5"-2" caliper, \$385 each

Medium sized slow growing native tree, 30-50 feet tall

Full sun to part shade


Tolerates poorly drained soils

Known for its gorgeous red and orange fall color

Important source of nectar for pollinators.

Provides crucial, high-fat, late summer food source to support wildlife

Bur oak, *Quercus macrocarpa*



1.5"-2" caliper, \$385 each

Large maturing tree, 60'+

Full sun location

Highly adaptable native oak tree that tolerates drought, wet soils and clay soils once established.

Extensive root system anchors it solidly against the wind.

Important larval food source for many butterfly species; attracts migratory songbirds

Oaks are a keystone species that support more life forms – including hundreds of caterpillar species, birds and mammals- than any other native tree genus!

Silver Linden, *Tilia tomentosa*



1.5"-2" caliper, \$375 each

Medium size tree, 50' tall, with a pyramidal oval canopy.

Dark green leaves with silvery fuzzy undersides that turn bright yellow in the fall.

Nectar rich flowers are very fragrant

Full sun to part shade; tolerates drought and urban conditions

Attracts butterflies and other pollinators

American Fringetree, *Chionanthus virginicus*



6' tall, \$385 each

Slow growing, graceful, showy native ornamental tree.

Matures at 12-20 feet tall and wide, multi-stem rounded habit.

Fragrant white flowers in early summer.

Full sun to part sun locations. Will tolerate clay soil and some drought, prefers moist, well drained soils.

Host plant for specialized moth species and its fruit provides a food source for wildlife.

Carolina silverbell, *Halesia carolina*



6'-7' tall, \$410 each

Native ornamental tree. Matures to 30-40 feet tall, 20-35 feet wide.

Sun or part shade.

Prefers rich, well drained, slightly acidic soils.

In spring, small white bell-shaped flowers mature into a 4-winged drupe.

Sweetbay magnolia, *Magnolia virginiana*



1.5"-2" caliper, multi-stem, \$385 each

Native small multi-stem flowering tree, semi-evergreen. 15-20 feet tall

Has lemony scented creamy white blooms in early summer. Attracts birds and bees.

Can tolerate wet soil. Full sun to shade conditions. Would benefit from a planting location protected from north winds.

Eastern Hophornbeam, *Ostrya virginiana* (also called Ironwood)



1.5"-2" caliper, \$410 each

Small slow growing native tree. Typically grows 20-35' tall, 25' wide

Pest resistant, tolerant of drought with hard wood that performs well in ice and snow.

Its fruit look like beer hops.

Does not need full sun, prefers partial to deep shade.

American holly, *Ilex opaca*



5'-6' tall, \$475 each


Broadleaf, native evergreen tree. Grows slowly and will reach 40'+ tall, 10-20' wide

It can be planted in full sun to partial shade and is highly deer resistant. Best in protected locations from winter winds and from afternoon sun.

Provides winter interest with its red berries. The fruit is a wildlife food source and is a host plant for the Henry's elfin butterfly.



