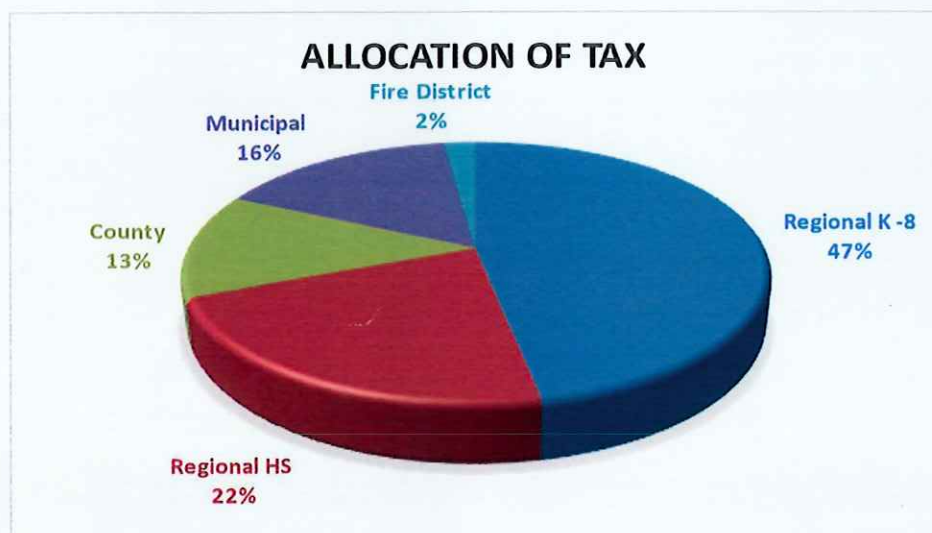


Township of Manalapan

Enclosed is your tax bill, which is made up from numerous budgets set by different governing bodies: the school budgets, the county budget, fire districts budgets and the township's municipal budget. While the township only has oversight and jurisdiction over the municipal portion of the bill, we are required to collect all taxes and then pay each entity their full share.

The Township Committee continues to provide high quality and essential municipal services to the residents of Manalapan while minimizing the impact to township taxpayers.



As you can see on the exhibit to the left, **the Township only retains sixteen percent** of every dollar collected. If you have any questions concerning any of the amounts, please contact that agency directly.

STORMWATER POLLUTION: WHAT DO YOU THINK?

- You may think littering is no big deal (it is).
- You may think that whatever runs into the storm drains gets treated before it reaches local rivers and streams (it isn't).
- You may think motor oil and other hazardous materials doesn't harm the water very much (it does).

Pollution seeps into the ground and is carried by stormwater (rain and snow) directly to our drinking water, streams, lakes and oceans. Contaminated stormwater is the #1 cause of water pollution in New Jersey. Simple things, like proper clean-up after oneself and careful use of chemicals in the home, office and yard, are helpful ways for businesses and residents to protect the water.

Manalapan Township has ordinances aimed at reducing pollution from litter, fertilizer, oil, pesticides, detergents, animal waste, grass clippings and other debris. For details, see www.mtnj.org/government. Thank you for keeping them in mind and doing your share.
